Entry Requirements

To be selected for entry into **AHC50516 Diploma of Arboriculture** applicants are required to complete a suitability review, a task participation and medical checklist and a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) evaluation, prior to enrolment. Applicants must also be currently employed within the industry and be able to demonstrate:

- Completion of AHC30816 Certificate III in Arboriculture (or AHC30810 Certificate III in Arboriculture) or equivalent or the completion of a Certificate III or higher-level qualification in a related discipline
- A minimum of 24 months' relevant industry experience in vegetation management which has included the inspection/assessment and maintenance of trees

Applicants must also have access to a laptop computer and be proficient in computer skills sufficient to conduct research and complete word-processed assignments, projects and reports


