- This program is most suited to applicants who have completed a Certificate III or higher-level qualification in a related discipline and possess a minimum of 24 months' relevant industry experience in vegetation management which has included the inspection/assessment and maintenance of trees.
- Applicants must also have access to the internet and a laptop computer and be proficient in computer skills sufficient to conduct research and complete word-processed assignments, projects and reports and to enter data into an online portal.

Training Location: Remote: Log-in via Virtual Classroom and Online Platform.


Assessment: Assignments to be completed and submitted via online platform.

Entry Requirements

To be selected for entry into AHC50524 Diploma of Arboriculture, applicants are required to complete a suitability review and a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) evaluation, prior to enrolment. Applicants must have achieved the following units of competency or their equivalent prior to commencing this qualification:

- AHCARB323 Identify trees or equivalent
- AHCARB314 Implement a tree maintenance program or equivalent
- AHCARB316 Perform pruning operations or equivalent

Training, RPL and assessment only pathways for these units of competency are available for eligible students.
